TOP 2019-2020 Activities

Review of members' input...

Our article <u>What Do Members of CATESOL TOP-IG Want from their Interest Group?</u> described responses to a survey conducted in Spring 2019 by 2018-2019 TOP Co-coordinators Marsha Chan and Ellen Lange, along with Assistant Coordinator Jaydene Elvin.

Highlights of the 2019 survey:

Through TOP-IG platforms members indicated a desire for:

- Resources for teaching pronunciation (73.9%)
- Techniques for teaching stress, rhythm & intonation (73.9%)
- Information about integrating pronunciation into speaking/listening classes (60.9%)
- Information about teaching pronunciation for presentation skills
- Information about teaching connected speech
- Information for integrating technology for teaching pronunciation

Members also expressed they would like to use the TOP-IG social media to receive information about events and resources they can use.

Coordinators' responses to TOP members' interests

These broad topics, along with the input obtained from a small number of members in our February and June 2020 polls, and the requirements of shifting to remote learning and teaching due to the COVID-19 pandemic, were kept in mind as sessions were planned for conferences and PD events.

2019 State Conference in San Jose

At the 2019 Annual Conference, Ellen and Marsha focused the Board-sponsored TOP Workshop on one of the most desired two topics (Resources for teaching pronunciation), which members can access here: <u>Resources beyond Textbooks for Teaching Pronunciation</u>. Marsha also presented a session Teaching the Pronunciation of the High-frequency Liquids L and R.

2020 Spring Coaching Workshops

From March 13 to 25, a dozen CATESOL leaders responded to the emergency shut-down of schools by offering free online training for CATESOL members and non-members. The discussion sessions and in-

teractive workshops helped ESL teachers begin adjusting from face-to-face classroom teaching to remote instruction, giving reassurance, guidance, encouragement, and support. While many addressed global changes in curriculum and planning and on using Zoom video conferencing for different types of classes and students, some focused on specific apps. Among those that address concerns of Teachers of Pronunciation and that have video recordings available to members from the <u>CATESOL homepage</u> under Resources > Online Training are Teaching Listening Lessons on Zoom Role-play Listening, Speaking, and Pronunciation for Low-tech Learners.

2020 Spring Virtual Conference

15 webinars were delivered at CATESOL's first virtual conference in May, and videos of all sessions, plus the President's opening and closing remarks, are available from the homepage under Resources > Online Training. One by Marsha was devoted to pronunciation: Listener-Friendly English Pronunciation for Vietnamese, Cantonese, and Mandarin Speakers.

2020 Summer Professional Development series

CATESOL leaders shared a wealth of knowledge and skills in our Summer 2020 Professional Development (PD) series, designed to help members be prepared for online teaching in the Fall. Altogether, 34 Summer PD events were scheduled between 30 June and 17 September. Webinars with audience participation, they included a mix of academic, pedagogical & social discussions and sharing, incorporated discussion & practice using breakout rooms. Six of them related to the teaching of pronunciation. Videos are available here and from the homepage under Resources > Online Training.

<u>Are you Remotely Concerned about Teaching Pronunciation?</u> Hosted by Marsha and Jaydene Elvin, this informal gathering designed to get to know TOP-IG members and current interests, drew 57 registrants. <u>Teaching Syllables and Stress, the Building Blocks of Rhythm and Intonation</u>, an interactive workshop by Marsha, drew 21 registrants. Role-play Listening, Speaking, and Pronunciation for Low-Tech Learners, conducted on two occasions

by Marsha, drew 23 and 51 registrants.

<u>Do You Hear What I Hear? Intonation Training</u>, an interactive auditory training session by Marsha, drew 30 registrants.

<u>Teaching Pronunciation through Interactive Drama-based Activities</u>, an interactive workshop by Jaydene, drew 39 registrants.
